Hospice 101: Basics Every Nurse Practitioner Should Know

As a nurse practitioner, are you helping your agency by providing pertinent information to the physician regarding hospice eligibility? Are you using your skills as a nurse practitioner to appropriately help manage symptoms in hospice patients? Are you using your knowledge, skills, and expertise as a nurse practitioner to educate and support the hospice staff? This workshop will provide the hospice nurse practitioner with information that will enhance your role as a vital member of the hospice team.

workshop objectives:

1. Identify the mission of hospice care
2. Explain common standards of hospice care
3. Understand the core services of hospice care as described by Medicare
4. Contrast the levels of hospice care as described by Medicare
5. Differentiate the levels of hospice care based on eligibility requirements
6. Identify guidelines for hospice eligibility based on medical diagnosis
7. Explain the components and requirements of the hospice face-to-face and its importance in establishing eligibility and the continued need for hospice care
8. Identify valid screening tools/protocols for the assessment of distressing symptoms that affect the hospice patient's quality of life
9. Describe evidence-based strategies to manage these distressing symptoms affecting quality of life in the hospice patient
10. Explain teaching points for patients and caregivers to help identify worsening symptoms and then to alert the hospice care team to intervene as well as principles for developing effective teaching tools
11. Describe the progression of symptoms that could necessitate a change in level of care for the hospice patient
12. Summarize the role of the hospice nurse practitioner as an integral part of the hospice team
